PEON GAME

To Play This Game You Need:

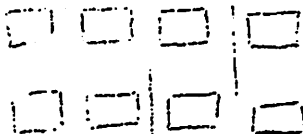
A. 2 small bones or objects per player
(1 black and 1 white) Only one team plays at a time

B. 15 counting sticks

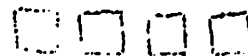
Four (4) men make up a team. They sit facing the other team. To begin the game, the players on one team begin to sing songs, moving the pieces from hand to hand and manipulating them under a blanket. The opposite team watches the four players closely and suddenly stops the play by a gesture, indicating where he believes each of the pieces of bone are. If he guesses correctly he wins four sticks.

The score is kept with counting sticks. Fifteen sticks win the game. The Quoyme is the referee who judges the game and gives the sticks away.

CHICO SHOTS - Playing on the outside

GRANDE SHOTS - Playing from the middle

ONE FINGER - Whites are touching your fingers

TWO FINGERS - Whites are away from your fingers

MEDA - Whites are to the inside

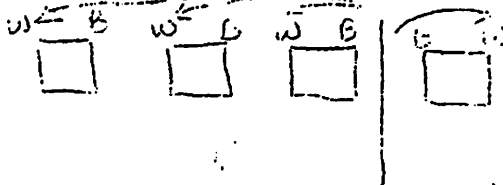
WHEDA - Whites are to the outside

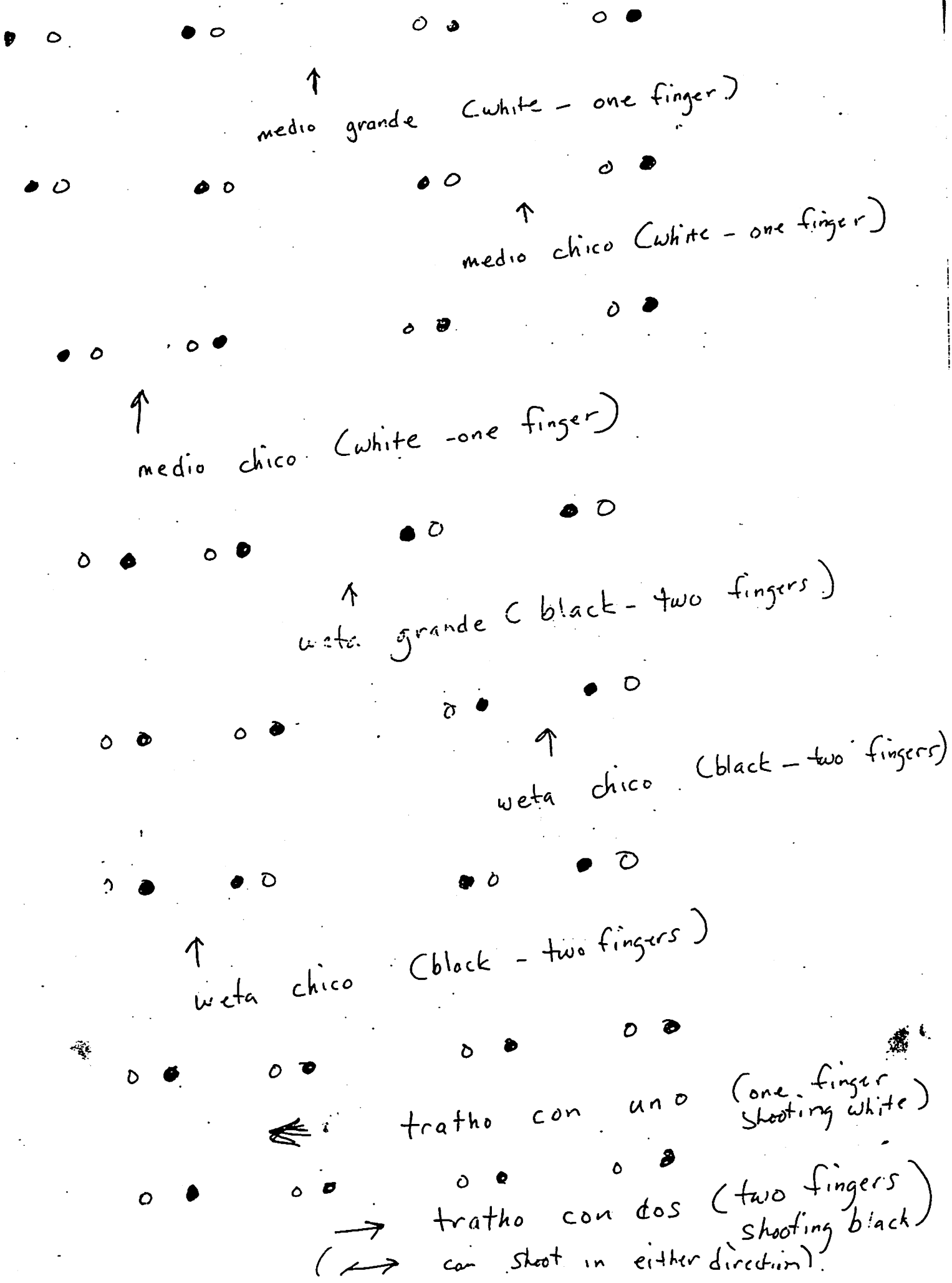
SHOT CALLED:

Meda Grande - 1 finger means all whites facing the middle



Wheda Chico - 2 fingers means all whites to the outside
